## Job opportunities

Supporting over 80,000 jobs<sup>3</sup>, there are many part-time and full-time employment opportunities within the City of Newcastle. Total job vacancies in the Hunter region rose 225% from 2,120 in early 2020 to 6,898 by the end of 2021, reflecting the economy-wide trend of demand for employment<sup>8</sup>. The major industries operating within the region include health care and social assistance, education, training, retail trade, construction and accommodation, professional, scientific and technical services and food services, to name a few.

# Cost of living

Before granting a student visa, the Australian Government Department of Home Affairs will require you to show or declare that you have enough funds to pay for your expenses while in Australia.

The Australian Government requires that international students have a minimum of A\$29,710 to stay in Australia for 12 months.<sup>1</sup>





# Scholarships



## The University of Newcastle College of International Education Diversity Scholarships

The University of Newcastle College of International Education is proud to offer our students some of the most competitive scholarships available in Australia, which are up to 30% of tuition fees for selected programs depending on student nationality.



## Kaplan Family Bursary

Students with a sibling who also enrolls with our College will be eligible for the Kaplan Family Bursary. The bursary provides 10% off the tuition fee of the second sibling to accept the offer and commence studies.

## Eligibility for College Scholarships

To be eligible for a scholarship at the College of International Education, you must meet all the following requirements:

- You must be a full-fee paying international student;
- Your studies at the College must begin in 2026;
- You are enrolled in a pathway program at the College of International Education;
- You must not be a recipient of other College of International Education scholarships or grants, or a government-sponsored student for the duration of a College scholarship.
