Yuvraj Pokhrel and Madhu Regmi, two students from Nepal, who have been supported by the human rights organisation Maiti Nepal since their childhood, were fully funded by CDU to embark on their higher education journey. Graduating with a Master of Business Administration, they have found their confidence in personal development and aspire to further Maiti's mission of combating human trafficking and child exploitation, both in Nepal and internationally.

Founded in 1993, Maiti Nepal is a non-profit organisation dedicated to protecting and empowering Nepali women and children affected by domestic violence, trafficking, and exploitation. Through rescue, rehabilitation, education, and legal advocacy, it has transformed thousands of lives. In 30 years, the organisation has rescued over 3,600 women and girls, supported 36,000 survivors, secured 1,800 convictions, facilitated 2,700 job placements, and provided 1,450 educational opportunities.

Since March 2023, CDU has partnered with Maiti Nepal to help build brighter futures for trafficking survivors and orphaned children. Alongside scholarships for the two students, CDU has supported vocational training and education programs in Nepal and abroad. The CDU Maiti Nepal Fund also raises funds to contribute to the organisation's life-changing work.

How much does it cost to live in Australia?

The Department of Home Affairs has financial requirements you must meet to receive a student visa for Australia, which makes knowing the average living costs in Australia an important part of your financial preparation. The cost of living in Australia varies from city to city, and students should not expect to fund their studies or living costs in Australia through part-time employment only. You can find approximate expenses according to the city and lifestyle on the Australian Government website costofliving.studyaustralia.gov.au.

Fees and payments

During your studies, you will need to purchase textbooks and other items required to study. Textbooks can vary from \$200 to \$500 per semester, depending on your course. Other expenses might include stationery, printing, purchasing a laptop or computer, protective clothing, work materials, working with children clearances and computing programs. These will depend on your course.





Entry requirements

Academic entry requirements

You must meet the minimum academic entry requirements as part of your application.

ELICOS	You must meet the academic requirements of the primary degree program and the required English proficiency level. For EAP 3, students need an IELTS score of 5.5 overall, with no band lower than 5.0, or an equivalent result. For EAP 4, the requirement is an IELTS score of 6.0 overall, with no band lower than 5.5, or equivalent.
TAFE certificate programs	You will need a qualification equivalent to an Australian Year 10 High School Certificate.
TAFE diploma programs	You will need a qualification equivalent to an Australian Year 12 High School Certificate.
CDU International College first-year diplomas	You will need to achieve successful completion of the Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (or equivalent) and the awarding of an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR) of at least 50.*
Undergraduate	You will need a qualification deemed equivalent to an Australian Year 12 High School Certificate by the University's qualification assessment references. You may also be required to satisfy specific course requirements, such as a minimum overall grade score or prerequisite knowledge. For a complete list of common equivalencies by country, please visit our website.
Pre-master's programs	Accelerated International Masters Qualifying Program (MQP): You must have completed three years of post-secondary study. Additional postgraduate entry requirements from pre-master's degree programs may be required.
Postgraduate coursework	You will need a qualification which is deemed equivalent to an Australian bachelor's degree. You may also be required to satisfy specific course requirements such as a minimum overall grade score, prerequisite knowledge or work experience. Course-specific entry requirements are listed under the course details.
Higher Degree by Research	Master by Research (MRes) To be eligible for entry to an MRes you should have completed either: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. a bachelor degree with first-class or second-class honours; or2. a master's degree by coursework or extended master, which contains a substantial research component. Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) To be eligible for entry to a PhD you should have completed either: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. a bachelor honours degree with first-class or second-class honours division; or2. a master's qualification that contains a substantial research component.



English entry requirements

You must meet English entry requirements as part of your application. CDU accepts the following English tests for entry into the CDU International College, TAFE, and most undergraduate and postgraduate courses:

- CDU ELICOS (EAP 3 & 4)
- IELTS Academic including One Skill Retake
- Cambridge Advanced English (CAE)
- Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic module
- TOEFL Internet-based Test (iBT)
- Common European Framework Certificate of English Proficiency.

All tests are valid for two years from the test date to the date of commencement at CDU, unless otherwise specified. If you have studied English in your previous studies, you may meet the English language entry requirements if you have achieved the required grades and qualifications. However, some courses may require higher levels of English or only accept specific English language tests.

If you do not meet the entry requirements, there are alternative pathways through our partner institutions to assist you towards your Higher Education journey.

English for academic purposes

The Faculty of Arts and Society delivers English for Academic Purposes (EAP) courses to international students who meet academic entry requirements for either their undergraduate or postgraduate courses, but do not yet meet the required English proficiency. The courses develop the academic English skills necessary for success in university study.

There are two levels of English for Academic Purposes – EAP3 and EAP 4 which can be taken separately, or together, depending on a student’s English entry level and their destination degree. Each EAP level requires full-time participation over 10 weeks with a 20-hour weekly class requirement.




